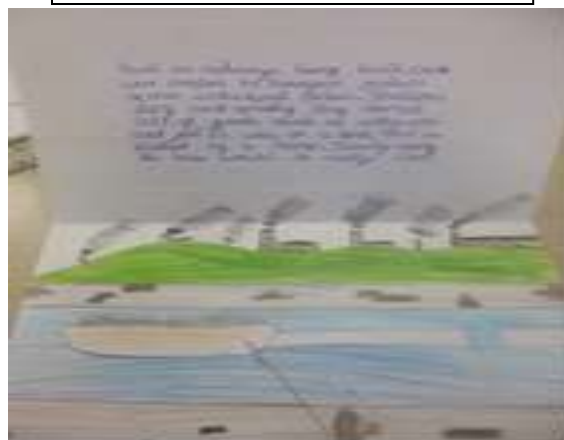


This term in Rivington Class our topic will be 'Space.' We will use science, literacy, music, art and history to explore the topic in depth. In literacy, the children will explore characterization as part of their sci-fi story writing. In science we will explore the links between time and space and some of the strange phenomena that exist in our galaxy. We will study music related to the theme of space and hopefully compose some music fit for a 'Moon Landing.' This music will then be manipulated as part of our ICT 'audio' topic where the children will learn to add effects to their compositions. In art we hope to look at the skills necessary to create 3D effects using both pencil and water colours. A short study of the Space race will be our history focus. As ever, the children will receive a sheet with 6 homework activities and are expected to complete 3 or more over the course of the half-term.
