## TOPIC: 'MEGA MIXES'



Home readers are a key part of homework and help your child to develop not only their reading skills but also their discussion and comprehension skills as well. Please could you try to ensure that your child reads everyday where possible. If they don't read their home reader but are reading a book, magazine or something else at home, please just make a quick note of it in their reading record. Thank you.



This term in Rivington Class our topic will 'Mega Mixes'. We will cover the separate subjects of science, music, art and ICT within the topic.

In Science, we will be looking at materials and states of matter. We will look at the things materials are used for and why, and the ways in which states of matter can be changed.

In Music and Computing, we will be recording and mixing sounds whilst in DT we will be learning to cook a few simple recipes. In art, we will be mixing together colours, namely water colours and acrylic paints in order to create a landscape painting.

In Literacy, we will be studying stories set in familiar settings with particular reference to Roald Dahl's classic 'George's Marvellous Medicine.' We will use the ideas and writing techniques from this book to develop and improve our own fictional story writing.
